To the Honorable Robert R. Prentiss, Judge of the Circuit Court of Southampton County, Virginia:

Your complainant Mary S. Scott hereby complaining shew to the court; that on the 22nd day of May 1872 she intermarried with Benjamin Scott in the county of Prince Edward in the State of Virginia, as will more fully appear by reference to an office copy of the marriage license and ministers return thereon, herewith filed as an exhibit marked "A" and prayed to be taken and read as a part of this bill. Your complainant and husband lived in said county till the year 1880 when they moved to the county of Southampton in the said State of Virginia, where they resided till July 1st, 1886 when said husband wilfully deserted and abandoned her, and carried off from their home all property belonging to him. That a few days before the time of the said desertion Hattie Scott, the daughter of your complainant and her said husband, complained that her said father had been having carnal intercourse with her and threatened to kill her if she told it.

Your complainant says that she believed the child who was then about sixteen years old and complained to her husband, and that your complainant was cruelly and brutally beat and used by said Benjamin Scott till he left. Your complainant says that she is informed he went to the City of Norfolk, and occasionally would return to her home, when and where he would cruelly beat and ill treat your said complainant. That these unwelcome visits would continue for only a few days at a time. Your complainant says that in 1888 he approached your complainant with a prayer of forgiveness and for a reunion, and your complainant, hoping he would be true to some of the many promises of reformation, again consented to live with him, that after about one month's time, he again became cross, cruel and abusive, and again wilfully deserted and abandoned your complainant. And that since that time he frequently comes to the home of your complainant in Southampton county, and threatens to beat and kill her, and tries in every conceivable way to annoy and harass her. He objects to any one in the neighborhood cultivating or assisting your complainant in the cultivation of the small farm on which she lives, that on some of the visits since the last desertion and abandonment aforesaid he not only threatens but actually beats your complainant. Your complainant says that these visits have become more frequent, and that your complainant is afraid that he will kill her, and if he does not kill her, he is making her existence miserable,

Complaint: Alleged:

To the Honorable Judge of the Circuit Court of Southampton

relief may be afforded your complainant as the nature of her case may require, and, will if not prevented force her to leave her home where she can best support her infant children who are wholly dependant upon her for a support. Your complainant says she can not rent the land, nor can she get it cultivated so long as her husband is allowed to make his visits and to threaten any one she hires to do any work of any kind for her.

Your complainant says that she has, at all times and always, been to her said husband a true and faithfull wife, and has borne him in all eleven children, of whom four are dead, and the following are living; William Edwards Scott now 26 years old; Charlie Scott now 24 years old; Minnie Scott now 19 years old; Josie F. Scott now 17 years old; Mary B. Scott now four years old and Bernice Scott one year old on the 24th day of April 1899.

Your complainant says that all said children except the two first above named are living with her, and are dependant on her for a support, and towards the support of which her said husband does not contribute one cent.

Your complainant says that she owns in her own right a small tract of land near Iver in said Southampton county in the State of Virginia, containing 30 acres, more or less, on which there is a small dwelling house which is the dwelling place of your complainant and her dependant children, and at which by hard labor she could live and support her children, and be at comparative ease if said Benjamin Scott could be kept away or restrained when there.

For as much as your complainant is restless save in this court where such matters are alone and properly cognizable, she prays that said Benjamin Scott be made a party defendant to this bill, and, required to answer the same, but an answer on oath is hereby expressly waived, that said wife, your complainant, be granted a divorce a mensa et torro, and finally in the progress of this cause, be granted a divorce a vinculo matrimonii. that the custody and care of the said infant children be given your complainant, that an injunction be awarded your complainant restraining said defendant, Benjamin Scott, from imposing any restraint on her personal liberty, or in any wise molesting or interfering with your complainant, her children, and those in her employment, or who may be at work on her premises, and from visiting the said home of your complainant in said Southampton County, Virginia, and from interfering with your complainant in the management, control and disposition of her property, that all such other, further and general

relief may be afforded your complainant as the nature of her case may require,
or as to equity and good conscience may seem meet, that said defendant may be
required to pay any and all proper counsel fees which may be due from your
complainant for services in this suit, and she will ever pray &c.

Q. State your name, age, residence, occupation and if you are related or connected with the parties to this suit?

A. My name is Dawson Warren. Am twenty-three years old and I live in Southampton County two miles from Ivor. Am no kin and I am not connected with the parties to this suit.

A. Not over two hundred yards.

I. We lived in Prince Edward County eight years and then moved to Southampton County where I now live and where I have lived ever since that time.

The depositions of Mary C. Scott, Geo. W. Horne, and Geo. W. Simmons taken before me, a Notary Public, in and for the County of Isle of Wight and State of Virginia, no special notice having been given because the defendant is a non resident of the state, who has been proceeded against by order of publication, according to law, on the 21st day of May, 1903, between the hours of ten A. M. and three P. M. to be read as evidence on behalf of Mary C. Scott in a certain suit in equity, depending in the Circuit Court of Southampton County, wherein Mary C. Scott is plaintiff and Ben Scott is defendant.

Present, Wm. S. Holland, Attorney for the plaintiff, Mary C. Scott, who was Mary C. Branch, a witness of lawful age, being duly sworn deposes and says,

Q. State your name, age, residence, occupation and relation to the parties to this suit?

A. Mary C. Scott is my name, I am 47 years old, reside in Southampton County, about two miles from Ivor, and my occupation is that of farming, and I am the plaintiff in this suit.

Q. State whether or not you are a married woman, when you married and who you married?

A. Yes, I am a married woman, I was married in Prince Edward County May 22, 1872, they got the license at Farmville, and I married Ben Scott.

Q. How long did you and Ben Scott live together in Prince Edward County?

#2.

A. We lived in Prince Edward County eight years and then moved to Southampton County where I now live and where I have lived ever since that time.

Q. Where is your husband Ben Scott?

A. I do not know.

Q. When did he leave you?

A. He left me seven years ago this Spring.

Q. In what County did you and he last live together as man and wife?

A. In Southampton County.

Q. Will you please tell me if you know what caused him to leave?

A. We fell out on account of our daughter. She claimed that he kept bothering after her and she came to me to stop him. He fell out with me about it and he left.

Q. Did you with your own eyes ever see any bad conduct between your husband and your daughter?

A. I never saw him do what she accused him of doing with my own eyes, but from his actions for some time, I fully believe he was guilty of bad conduct with my daughter, in fact I have no doubt whatever about it and I know that it caused him to leave the county and the country.

Q. You have said it was your daughter, do you mean that it was your daughter and his daughter, born while you were living together as man and wife?

A. Yer Sir, it was his child and my child.

Q. How old was the child?

A. About fifteen years old.

Q. As a mother did you see any sign or know anything which caused you to believe he was guilty of bad conduct with his daughter?

his daughter? many of these children are now living with

A. I knew he was of that nature. I had seen other things about him that caused me to believe that so strong. I seen other things of him around his own family and around other people and that is the reason I believe that, and from what I saw of my daughter I know he was guilty.

Q. Has he been back since he left, to your house?

A. No Sir, not as I know of. I have not seen him there.

Q. Have you seen him any where since that time?

A. I saw him at Ivor about four years ago. I only saw him a few minutes.

Q. Have you ever heard from him since?

A. I have heard that he was living in the State of New Jersey, but I don't know where he is.

Q. Have you and he ever lived together as husband and wife since the first time he left about seven years ago this Spring?

A. No Sir. Not since he left the first time.

Q. Did he have any property when he left you?

A. He had very little and carried away everything that belonged to him when he went away.

Q. Please state the names and ages of your children?

A. Willaim Scott is somewhere about thirty years old, Minnie Scott is about twenty-two years old; Josie F. Scott is about twenty or twenty-one now; Sam'l Scott is about thirteen years old and Bernice Scott is about seven years old. I have got six children who are dead and these children are all the children of Ben Scott.

A. Four are living with me and one of these four stays in Washington a part of the time. My oldest child, William Scott lives in Baltimore.

Q. State your name, age, residence and occupation?

A. Geo. W. Horne, is my name, I reside in Southampton County about two miles from Ivor, and about half a mile from where Mary Scott lives. I am thirty-nine years old and my occupation is that of a farmer.

Q. How long have you been living where you now live Mr. Horne?

A. All my life. I have been living on the same farm all my life.

Q. Do you know a colored man named Ben Scott?

A. Yes Sir:

Q. About how long did he and Mary Scott live together as man and wife in Southampton County?

A. About twelve years. I am guessing at the length of time.

Q. Do you know where Ben Scott is now?

A. No Sir:

Q. About what time did he leave his home and wife?

A. I think about seven years ago.

Q. Have you seen or heard of him for the last three or four years?

A. No Sir.

Q. There is no doubt whatever about his having left the county is there?

A. No Sir.

Q. Has Mary C. Scott lived at the same place since he has been gone?

A. Yes Sir.

Q. Has Mary Scott ever worked for you?

A. Yes Sir, she has worked for me frequently, picking off peas and doing other work.

Q. Is she a truthful, honest colored woman?

A. I would just as soon she would owe me a hundred dollars as any body I know of. She never owed me a dollar but what she paid it. She is a very industrious colored woman, got a little too much mouth sometimes and that is the only fault I know of her at all.

Q. Please state your name, age, residence and occupation?

A. Geo. W. Simmons is my name, I am thirty-seven years old, am a farmer and live in Southampton County about a quarter of a mile from Mary C. Scott.

Q. Do you know Ben Scott, the husband of Mary Scott?

A. Yes Sir.

Q. Tell as near as you can how long Bary Scott and Ben Scott lived together as man and wife in Southampton County?

A. As near as I can estimate, it was about thirteen years.

Q. Did you visit their house while they lived together?

A. Yes Sir, often.

Q. Did they seem to get along tolerably well?

A. Yes Sir, they seemed to get along well.

Q. Where is Ben Scott now?

A. I really do not know. The last I heard of him they said he was living in New Jersey.

Q. How long since he and his wife Mary Scott separated as near as you can tell?

dissolved, payable as the law directs, with ^{security} by the said
Clerk, deemed sufficient
