Be it Remembored That Thomas James Williams Bradley Robert Tyler and John Underwood of the county of Southampton came into court and personally acknowledging themselves to be indebted to our sovereign Lord King George the second in the sum of one hundred pounds each of their respective lands and tenements goods and chattels to be levied and to our said Lord the King his heirs and successors rendered Yet upon this condition that if each of them do personally appear before the justices of Oyer and Terminer at the Capital in Williamsburg on the second Tuesday in June next and there to give such evidence as they of each of them knoweth agt Richard Pick concerning the matters wherewith he is charged and that they do not depart thence without leave of the said court then this recognizance to be void
