This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the defendant being solemnly called and not appearing On the Motion of the said plaintiff It is Ordered that the conditional judgment obtained against the said defendant and Benjamin Simmons be confirmed for forty pounds the debt in the declaration mentioned Therefore It is Considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant & shew the said forty pounds and his costs by him in this behalf expended & the said defendant in mercy &c But this judgment except as to the costs is to be discharged by the payment of nineteen pounds nineteen shillings and five pence together with interest for the same to be computed after the rate of five per centum per annum from the 12 day of April 1754 to the time of payment

This day came the plaintiff by his attorney and the defendant being solemnly called and not appearing On the Motion of the said plaintiff It is Ordered that the conditional judgment obtained against the said defendant and Peter White his security be confirmed for thirteen pounds two shillings and six pence the debt in the declaration mentioned Therefore It is Considered by the court that the plaintiff recover against the said defendant & his security the said thirteen pounds two shillings and six pence and his costs by him above his suit in this behalf expended and the said defendant in mercy &c But this judgment except as to the costs is to be discharged by the payment of six pounds eleven shillings & three pence together with interest for the same to be computed after the rate of five per centum per annum from the 12 day of March 1755 till paid
