Ordered that James Turner John Little William Peeson and Simon Harris or any three of them do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Jane Smith deceased and return the appraisement to the court

An indented deed of gift between James Jones of the one part and Maria Jones of the other part was acknowledged by the said James and ordered to be recorded and Faith the wife of the said James personally appeared in court and being first privately examined as the law directs voluntarily relinquished her right of dower in the estate conveyed by the said indenture

Upon the petition of James Hardaway and Charles Williamson against John Jones for two pounds three shillings due by account This day came the plaintiffs by their attorney and the defendant having been duly summoned and served with a copy of the petition and account and not appearing On the Motion of the said plaintiffs It is Considered by the court that the plaintiffs recover against the said defendant the said two pounds three shillings and their costs in this behalf expended with a lawyers fee
