Ordered that Benjamin Buffin Charles Briggs Thomas Davis sen^r and Quincy Davis or any three of them being first sworn before a justice of the peace do appraise in current money the slaves if any and personal estate of Moses Savage deced and return the appraisement to the court.

For reasons appearing to the court It is Ordered that Ann Banks be exempt from paying Levies in this county James Ridley Peter Butts and Thomas Williamson are by the court recommended to the Honble Lieutenant Governor as fit sable persons to execute the office of Sheriff in this county for the ensuing year
