

Ordered that the account of Isaac Williams contains amounting to three shillings and thirteen pence be certified to the auditor of public accounts for his examination and payment

Ordered that the Overseers of the poor for this county (so be it out of Nathaniel Joy's estate of Philip Joy's) poor shall according to law

An account current and Settlement of the estate of Priscilla Westwood late of this county returned into court and ordered to be recorded

An account current and Settlement of the estate of John Glass late of this county returned into court and ordered to be recorded

The persons appointed by a former order of this court to view the conveniences and inconveniences of turning the public road leading thro' the lands of Thomas Holloman this day made their report and the following order for order In conformity to an order of the honorable court of South Carolina to us under date May 17th we have viewed the ground through which the old road run and also the ground through which the new road is to run and we do report to your honors that we do believe that turning the said road will be attended with no inconvenience to the merchants through which the new road runs now run Thomas Holloman there is but about 40 feet difference in the two roads under our hands as commissioners this 17th day of June 1744. Wm. Bayly, Selig Remondell, Holloman. Whereupon it is ordered that Thomas Holloman proprietor of the land through which the said road is proposed to be opened be summoned to appear here to show cause if any the can why the said road should not be opened agreeable to petition

Ordered that the account of Williams Joyner contains amounting to seven shillings and twenty five pence the account of John Moor amounting to five shillings and thirty six pence be certified to the auditor of public accounts for his examination and payment

Ordered that the account of Jacob Darden Sheriff of this county amounting to twelve shillings and pence be certified to the auditor of public accounts for his examination and payment

The Commonwealth against Samuel Drury upon a warrant for a breach of the peace the defendant was set to the bar in custody of the Jailor into whose custody he was heretofore committed and the defendant being heard by counsel the court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the said Samuel Drury find Security for his good behavior for the space of twelve calendar months from this day amounting in the sum of two thousand dollars and two Securities in the sum of one thousand dollars each and in default thereof that he be removed to jail

Ordered that the overseers of the poor be it out of Godman's Willing's a poor duty according to law

Ordered that the court be adjourned till court in course
