On the motion of Howell Myrick, for leave to keep an ordinary at his house in this County, till the first day of May next It is therefore ordered that the said Howell Myrick be permitted to keep an ordinary at his house in this County until the time aforesaid upon his paying the tax imposed by Law on ordinaries, which is accordingly done and ordered to be entered of Record

Ordered that the Sheriff of this County collect from John Buchler the sum of Eighty dollars, It being the amount of his bond, taken for the purchase of the old Jail and account with the Court according to Law

Ordered that Henry Briggs, Benjamin Devaney and William Joyner, or any two of them, do examine, state and settle the account of the administration on the estate of James Gardner deceased and make a report thereof to the Court

Ordered that the order of the last Court, committing the estate of Allen Dole deceased to the hands of the Sheriff of this County, be recorded and the same is hereby accordingly done which is ordered to be entered of Record

The Last will and Testament of Dianna Pitman deceased, was proved by the oaths of Mary Waper and Leisea Brown the witnesses therein and ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of Willis Wellons the executor therein named, who made oaths therein and together with Edward M Branch and James Waper his Secutors entered into and acknowledged a bond in the Penalty of fifteen hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs Certificate is granted the said Wellons for obtaining a probat thereof in due form

Ordered that John Clayton, John Waper, Richard Stephenson and James Waper or any three of them being first sworn before a Justice of the Peace, do well and truly appraise in current money, all the Personal Estate of Dianna Pitman deceased and return the appraisement under their hands to the Court

Ordered that Jacob Danson, Richmond Dillan and Jeps Pashin, or any two of them do examine, state and settle the account of the administration on the estate of Robert Johnson deceased, and make a report thereof to the Court

An Act of Convoy was proved and acknowledged in the Clerk's Office and ratified by two Justices of the Peace and admitted to record since the last Court in Pursuance of an act of Assembly in such Case made, and provided made day for introduction and ordered to be entered of Record
