

At a Court Summomed and held for the County of Southampton on the 15th day of July 1822 for the examination of Robin Wood who stands charged with feloniously stealing, taking and carrying away on the night of the sixth of this present month from and out of the possession of Butlow Travis one hive containing honey and bees the property of said Butlow Travis.

The Court being thus constituted the prisoner was led to the bar by the Sheriff of the County into whose custody he was heretofore committed and charged with the felony aforesaid and thereupon divers witnesses were sworn and examined on behalf of the Commonwealth touching the premises to wit Leonard Atkins, and John Travis and the prisoner being fully heard by counsel. The Court after hearing the testimony and all the circumstances of the case are of opinion that the prisoner is guilty of the said felony wherof he stands charged. Therefore it is considered that he be tried for the said offence at the next quarterly term of this Court and thereupon it is ordered that he be remanded to Jail -

Be it remembered that Leonard Atkinson here in Court acknowledged himself indebted unto his Excellency Thomas M Randolph Esq Governor or Chief Magistrate of this Commonwealth and his successors in Office for the time being in the sum of \$333.33 1/3 cents to be levied of his goods and chattels lands and tenements and to the said Governor and his successors for the use of the Commonwealth rendered. Yet upon this condition that if the said Leonard Atkinson shall personally appear before the Justices of the County Court of Southampton at the Courthouse on the first day of August next by 10 O'clock A.M. of that day then and there to give such evidence as he knows on behalf of the Commonwealth against Robin Wood and shall depart thence without the leave of the said Court then this recognizance to be void or else to remain in full force.
