This Indenture made this 20th day of June in the year of our
 Lord Christ one thousand eight hundred and eighteenth Between Joseph Denson of
 the Town of Suffolk and County of Northampton of the one part and Drawing
 Williams of the County of Southampton of the other part
 Witnesseth that in consideration of the sum of two hundred Dollars of
 lawful money of V. or of this Commonwealth to the said Joseph
 Denson of Drawing Williams in hand paid by Samuel Griffie who
 existed a Deed in Trust to them bearing date the 11th day of January
 1810 at or before the making & delivery of these presents, the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, they the said Joseph Denson & Drawing
 Williams have and each of them hath granted bargained and sold
 released and confirmed by these presents or receipt of them doth grant
 bargain and sell, release and confirm unto the said Samuel Griffie his
 heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land and premises
 whereon the said Samuel Griffie now lives and bounded as follows
 to wit Beginning at a red oak standing at the end of Samuel Rivers
 old ditch, running thereon along a line of marked trees to a red oak
