**This Indenture** made this 31<sup>st</sup> day of February

in the year one thousand eight hundred and nineteen  
between James Wille and Mary Wille his wife of the one part and  
Samuel Turner all of the County of Southampton State of Virginia of the  
other part Witnesseth that the said James Wille and Mary Wille  
wife for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand, three  
hundred and eighty dollars and 50 Cents to them in hand paid  
by the said Samuel Turner at or before the sealing & delivery of  
these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have  
granted, bargained, sold, aliened, released & confirmed and by these  
presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, release, and confirm unto  
the said Samuel Turner his heirs and assigns forever a Certain tract  
or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton  
on the South side of the Blunt swamp and known by the name of  
the Starrs tract it being the same which the said James Wille  
lately purchased of Benjamin Blunt as with the wife annoid of Mrs  
Blund (dece<sup>d</sup>), continuing by estimation three hundred, twenty nine  
and five eight acres more or less and is bounded as follows to wit  
Beginning at a pine in Capt James Lees line and running south eighty  
degrees west ninety eight poles to a red oak, thence north seventy five  
degrees west one hundred and forty eight poles to a black oak, thence  
north ten degrees west sixty two poles to a pine, thence north ten degrees  
east thirty eight poles to a pine, thence north thirty three and 3/4  
degrees east fifty four poles to three trees chief's inwards in  
Symon Harris old line thence south forty five degrees east one  
hundred & twenty one & a half poles to a dead oak a corner of  
Harris dece<sup>d</sup> and said land, thence north thirty eight degrees east  
twenty six poles to a pine, thence north sixty nine degrees east  
thirteen poles, thence east fifteen poles to a white oak, thence  
north six two degrees east six poles to a large white oak, thence  
north fifty degrees east twenty eight poles, thence north twenty eight  
degrees east thirty six poles, thence north seventeen degrees east  
twenty four poles to the head of a branch, thence north twenty seven  
degrees east twenty four poles to a black gum in the said branch  
thence north fifty six degrees west fourteen poles, thence north  
thirty four degrees west seventy six poles to a white oak thence  
north seven degrees east forty six poles, thence north fifty seven degrees  
east five poles to Lees mite pond, thence along the various courses
