This Indenture made this 12th day of May in the year of our Lord 1726 between Richard Brett
of the County of Southampton one of the one part and William Brett of the same part and Arington Brett of
the said County of Southampton the other part do hereby certify that the said Richard Brett for and in consideration of the sum
of thirty three dollars current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said William Brett
to wit ten dollars and one shilling by the said Arington Brett for the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and granted
unto the said Arington Brett his heirs executors and assigns all the tract or parcel of land containing by testimony
acres to the same more or less and bounded as followeth to wit by the South side by the land of William Brett
Northward and the land of the said Richard Brett to have and to hold the said tract or parcel of land with all and
singular the premises and appurtenances unto the said Arington Brett his heirs executors and assigns
to his and their own proper use and behoof forever without doubt for the effect whereof hereunto
unto the said William Brett his heirs executors and assigns the sum of thirty three dollars
together with legal interest and costs as witness in sequent of the present writing over before
with the day of this next or within few days thereafter that the said Arington Brett his heirs
advertisements may legally interpose and by publick advertisement giving ten days notice
another with the sale of the said bargain premises for such sum as may be or otherwise
from or by the said Richard Brett his heirs executors or administrators and that the
said Richard Brett his heirs executors and administrators shall be bound to make
a general warrant for the said tract of land to be purchased as provided the balance of money
paying the sum of thirty three dollars and thirty cents with legal interest and costs as aforesaid to be
returned to him the said Richard Brett his heirs executors and administrators provided nevertheless
that in case the said Richard Brett his heirs executors and administrators do and shall
well and truly pay or cause to be paid into the said Arington Brett his heirs executors
the sum of thirty three dollars thirty cents with legal interest and costs within the time specified
that then this writing is to become void and of none effect otherwise to remain in full force

have granted bargained and sold and by these presents do grant bargain and sell unto the
said Tally Johnson and his heirs forever one certain tract or parcel of land situate
