These Indentures Testifies made the first day of June in the year of our Lord 1825. Between James Battle of
 the County of the first part Nancy Adams of the same part and Lewis W. Day of the last part Whereas the said
 is hereby intended to be held and solemnized by the joining of the said James Battle and Nancy Adams at a
 Whereas the said James Adams is in possession of a tract of personal estate consisting of one saddle bar and furniture to wit
 two check one can and half one Loom and harness one can of Iron and Girth one pot and one dish one tin one
 cups and saucers 3 silver table spoons two table one pair and one tray one spinning wheel and card and one
 and whereas it hath been agreed to bind the said James Battle shortly after the aforesaid marriage has been solemnized
 during the joint lives of them the said James Battle and Nancy Adams at a certain and undivided occupation of the said
 and also the interest and profits thereof from and after the decease of such of them the said James Battle and
 Nancy Adams as shall first happen to die should do at the sole and only expense of such a party of them the said
 the business and whereas it hath also been agreed that in case that after the said undivided marriage has been solemnized
 between the said James Battle and Nancy Adams that the said James Adams shall not have or claim any part of the real or personal estate the said James
 Adams he design or intends to at any time during a certain term of years after the said marriage shall be solemnized
 of the before recited agreement that for and secure execution of the sum of one dollar to be paid to the said Nancy Adams
 by the said Lewis W. Day at and before the wedding and delivery of these presents she except hereby acknowledging
 the said Nancy Adams by and with the free consent and agreement of the said James Battle to be in full and
 party is and his sealing and delivery of these presents as to grant bargain and sell assign and deliver unto the said Lewis
 W. Day his heirs executors administrators and assigns all the said property consisting of one Saddle two silver table
 spoons two check one can half one Loom and harness one can of Iron and Girth one pot one dish one tin one
 plates 70 silver cups and saucers 3 silver table spoons two table one pair and one tray one spinning wheel
 saucers unto the said Lewis W. Day his heirs and assigns upon trust our ourselves and to and for such use and
 purposes as are hereinafter expressed that is to say on trust for the said Nancy Adams and her assigns until the
 dissolution of the said undivided marriage and from and after the aforesaid dissolution of the said undivided marriage then
 upon trust that he the said Lewis W. Day his heirs executors administrators and assigns shall and lawfully
 the said James Battle and Nancy Adams together with the said James Battle and Nancy Adams the undivided wife to receive take and enjoy all the interest and profits of the said property hereby
 appropiated to and for his own use and benefit and from and after the decease of such of them the said James
 Battle and Nancy Adams as shall first happen to die then upon trust that the said Lewis W. Day his
 Executors administrators and assigns shall and lawfully transfer and pay over the said property to the said Nancy
 Adams in cash she should survive the said James Battle but if she should die before him then it shall
 person or persons and at the same and times and on such parts of proportion as aforesaid and from and after the death
 Nancy Adams shall from time to time receive and enjoy her portion by any writing or writings now or hereafter
 not attested by three or more credible witnesses or by her last will Testament in writing to be by her signed sealed and
 published and declared in the presence of the like number of attested credible persons as aforesaid to the intent that the
 same may not be at the disposal of or subject to the claims of debts or engagements of the said James
