This Indenture made and entered into this 19<sup>th</sup> day of July 1828 between  
Henry Barron of the first part James Rockelle of the second part and John H. Mason of the third  
part. Whereas the said Henry Barron is justly indebted to the said John H. Mason  
in the sum of five hundred Dollars due by note of equal date hereunto the payment  
whereof with the accruing interest thereon he is willing and desirous to secure to the  
said Mason This Indenture Witnesseth that the said Henry Barron in consideration of the  
premises and of the sum of one Dollar to him in hand paid by the said Rockelle  
before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged  
the said Henry Barron hath sold and delivered and by these presents do sell and convey to the said  
James Rockelle the following property (to wit) three horses two mules forty five hogs fifteen  
head of Cattle one sideboard four bedssteads & furniture one clock one secretary and  
dozen Windsor Chairs two Walnut tables one negro man named Moses aged  
about twenty years and the surplus of property or money which may remain after  
paying and satisfying the Debt and incidental expenses secured to a trust here  
by made of Trust now of record in the Clerk's office of Southampton for the particular  
articles of property reference is hereby made to the said records To have and hold  
the said property to him the said Rockelle his heirs &c forever upon Trust nevertheless  
that the said Barron is to be permitted to keep in his possession the said property until the 20<sup>th</sup>  
day of December next whereof the said sum of five hundred Dollars shall be still paid  
or any part thereof or any part of the interest thereon the said Rockelle is hereby authorized  
and required to take possession of the said property he may remove and after duly advertising  
the same and place of sale for ten days sell the same or so much as may be necessary  
for the purposes aforesaid and pay off the proceeds the said sum of five hundred Dollars  
with interest thereon from this day to the said Mason and the costs attending the  
execution of this Trust and the balance if any pay or deliver to the said Henry Barron

the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesseth that whereas the above  
named Charles W. Godwyn stands justly indebted to Elizabeth Mason of the County and  
State aforesaid in the just and full sum of seven hundred and forty Dollars and eighty eight  
cents by Bond bearing date with these presents the said Charles W. Godwyn desires to secure  
pay the same and for and in consideration of the sum of one Dollar in hand paid to the said  
Charles W. Godwyn by the aforesaid John M. Gurley at and before the sealing and delivery of  
these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged and the said Charles W. Godwyn  
doth by these presents doth bargain sell and confirm unto the aforesaid John M. Gurley or  
his certain Attorney one certain Tract of Land containing seventy acres more or less known  
by the name of Towell's place adjoining lands of James Swell Sr. & William Norton the  
above described Tract of Land To have and to hold the aforesaid Land and premises and appur-  
tenances unto him the said John M. Gurley his heirs and assigns forever and the aforesaid Charles  
W. Godwyn doth hereby covenant to and with the said John M. Gurley for himself his heirs & assigns  
forever to warrant and defend the right and title whereof Likewise the following personal property  
that is to say one negro Man named Arthur one named Sam all of which the aforesaid Charles W.  
Godwyn further covenants and agrees for himself and his heirs and assigns forever to warrant & defend
