Williams and Mary A. his wife for and in consideration of the sum of seven thousand dollars to them in hand paid - the said George B. Cary, at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Nathaniel T. Williams and Mary A. his wife do hereby acknowledge, and forever acquit and discharge the said George B. Cary of the same: hath granted, bargained, sold, aliened, conveyed, and confirm and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell, alien, convey and confirm unto him the said George B. Cary his heirs & assigns, one tract or parcel of land lying on the North side of Meherrin River containing by estimation Eight hundred and ninety one and 1/4 acres more or less, lying in the County of Southampton, Virginia, and Southampton County North Carolina and bounded by the lands of Nathl T. Williams, William D. Phillips and others. To have and to hold the aforesaid tract of Land with all the (profits) commodities and issues and all and singular the appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining to him the said George B. Cary his heirs and assigns forever in fee, to have and to hold free from all hindrance and incumbrance whatsoever, and the said Nathaniel T. Williams and Mary A. his wife for themselves Their heirs executors and administrators doth hereby covenant and agree with the said George B. Cary that they will warrant and defend the right and title to the said lands herein conveyed to the said George B. Cary his heirs or assigns against the claim or claims demand or demands of all person or persons whatsoever.
