Drury, parties to a deed bearing date the 18th day of April 1837, and her name annexed, personally appeared before us in our County aforesaid and being examined by us privately and apart from her husband, and having the said aforesaid fully explained to her, she acknowledged the same to be her act and deed, & that she had willingly signed, sealed and delivered the same, and that she wished not to retract it. Given under our hands and seals this 27th day of April 1837.

This Indenture made and entered into this 6th day of October in the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty six between James Wells of the one part and Wells Mearns of the other part, Witnesses that for and in consideration of eighty five dollars current money in hand paid by the said Wells Mearns, to the said James Wells hath bargained and sold and by these presents doth bargain and sell unto him the said Wells Mearns one certain tract or parcel of land containing twenty five acres more or less, being the tract formerly belonging to Thomas Conroy & de^o and bounded by the road leading from Jerusalem to Monroe, the land of Richard Barnett, Wells Mearns and Stephen Mordough - To have and to hold said tract of land with the Tenements and all and singular the premises hereinbefore mentioned or intended to be bargained, and sold with every part and parcel thereof unto him the said Wells Mearns his heirs and assigns forever. And the said James Wells for himself and his heirs the said tract of land with all and singular the premises and appurtenances unto the said Wells Mearns his heirs and assigns free from the claim of him the said James Wells and his heirs and of all and every person whatsoever shall, will and do warrant and forever defend by these presents.
