This Indenture made and entered into this 16th day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty three, between Henry Joyner of the first part Henry Kendrick of the second part, and Benj. C. Pope of the third part, all of the County of Southamptown and State of Virginia, Whereas the said Henry Joyner is indebted to the said Benj. C. Pope in the sum of Four hundred and forty seven dollars, by bond of even date with this deed and the said Henry Joyner being desirous to secure the said Benj. C. Pope, and for the consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Henry Kendrick before the sealing and delivery of these presents, hath granted bargained (and sold unto the said Henry Kendrick his heirs executors administrators or assigns the following property to wit, one negro woman mason forty bbls corn and eight stacks fodder 2000 lbs. salted pork one sorrell mare and weaners, one cream horse, twelve head cattle, forty head hogs five beds of furniture with all other household and kitchen furniture, furnishing utensils one still room, and caps, forty cider casks one apple mill and press, also any interest in
