This indenture was entered into this day of _____ 1852, between Merit J. Davis of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the one part and Edward Crumpler of the said County and State of the other part: Witness the said Merit J. Davis for and in consideration of the sum of Twelve hundred dollars to him in hand paid at or before the making and delivery of these presents (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) Chath bargain and sale, grants and confirms unto the said Edward Crumpler his heirs or assigns a certain tract or parcel of land with all its appurtenances lying and being in the County of Southampton and State of Virginia commonly called and known as "London" containing two hundred and ninety six acres more or less and bounded as follows: Beginning at the Schoolhouse situated in the fork of the road leading to Horningsville, then down the Horningsville road to a small stream or branch, thence along the said branch to the line of Nelson H. Barton, thence along the line of the said Barton to Lon. Cobb's line, thence along the said Cobb's line to Etheldreda Warren's line, then down said Warren's line to the line of the Heirs of W^m Battle dec^d then along the last mentioned line to the first named station at the School House: To have and to hold the said Land and its appurtenances to the only proper use of the said Edward Crumpler and his assigns free from the claim or claims of the said Merit J. Davis his heirs and assigns forever and all persons persons whatsoever claiming the same. The right and title whereof to the said land I warrant and defend to be good unto the said Edward Crumpler his Heirs or assigns forever free from myself, my Heirs, and assigns: and from all and every person whatsoever claiming the same.
