This Deed made this 18th day of February in the year eighteen hundred and sixty,
between Clara Bowers of Sintampson County and State of Virginia, of the one part
and Sadler Lawrence of Isle of Albright County and State of Virginia of the other part.
Witness that in consideration of the sum of two thousand Dollars to him in hand paid
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged. The said Clara Bowers doth grant, bargain
and sell unto the said Sadler Lawrence all the tract or parcel of land called White
place included in the following boundaries and in which he (Clara White) resided
at the time of his decease containing four hundred and eighty six acres more or less, and
bounded as follows, to wit; Beginning at a Sweet gum standing near the edge of the
Cattail Swamp and a little below the old White Dam, thence on east
course along a line of marked trees to a Poplar Gum standing near the old road
bearing east along a line of marked trees across the edge of Island land
to a cypress standing on Black Walnut river, thence up Black Walnut to the mouth
of Black Creek, thence up Black Creek to near Ballards new line
Hemlock, when it connects with the mill tract line of marked trees running
a west course up to and round the poeover until it connects with Louis Jones line
thence still bearing west along a line of marked trees to the main head or center where
that is no such main stem of the Cattail Swamp, thence down the various
courses of the said Cattail Swamp to the Sweet Gum the first Station, with all
