And the said Ann Speed for herself, her heirs, executors, & Administrators, the said tract of Land, and every of its appurtenances, unto the said George Speed, his heirs and assigns, shall and will warrant, & forever defend by these presents, against the lawful claim of all and every person or persons whatsoever & whomsoever. Witness to this indenture made this eighth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety Five, between William Brit of the County of Southampton, of the one part, and Joseph Brit of the same County of the other part, Witnesseth that the said William Brit for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty pounds and money of Virginia, to him in hand paid by the said Joseph Brit, before the signing and delivering hereof, the receipt whereof the said William Brit, doth hereby acknowledge, hath granted, bargained & sold, and doth by these presents, grant, bargain, and sell unto the said Joseph Brit, his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract and parcel of Land, situate lying & being, in the County of Southampton, on the South side of a branch called Fawcett's branch, containing by estimation, one hundred Acres, be the same more or less, it being a part of a 200 foot line taken up, and surveyed by Edward Brit Esq. and bounded as followeth, Beginning, at the corner of Fawcett's branch in the Boykin line then being, at a line of marked trees to a corner tree a red oak in the said Boykin line, a corner tree, then along a line of marked trees to a white oak, a corner tree in the Boykin line, then along a line of marked,
