Whether the said Henry Harrison j. was not duly appointed
her guardian & in virtue of such Trust receive the said
sum of money. whether he did not give such bond to the
Court. with the other dependants his Securitys Conditioned for
the due Faithful discharge of the trust of Guardian to your
Orator in her minority? & that the said money & interest
arising hereon ever discharged & paid? & why has it not?
And that this Court will decree that the said Administration
of the said Henry Harrison j. died & the said
his Securitys be by
compelled to Account with & pay unto your Orator the
aforesaid sum of £30. with interest Calculated agreeable
to the Custom of the Court. from such time as the aforesaid
sum of money came to the hands of the said Henry Harrison
junior his guardian as afd. May it please the
Ketto. for Compt.

To the worshipful Court of Isle of Wight county in Chancery
Samuel Lightfoot & Sarah his wife ^{Assembly shew}

That your orator's father Henry Harrison died by his last will &
testament bearing date the 13 day of September 1771. duly proved &
recorded gave to your orator the sum of thirty pounds Cash.

That soon after the death of the said Henry the father one Henry
Harrison junr was by the Court appointed guardian to your orator
^{his daughter}
^{same bond for the perform^{ance} of his trust with}
who in consequence thereof received into his hands the aforesaid
thirty pounds, which remained in his hands until the time of
his death, which happened sometime about the month of

1778. intestate when administration of all singular his goods
& chattels rights & credits were in due form granted unto Peggy
his widow who gave bond to the said Court with Richard Hardy
& Abel Jaser her securities for her due & faithful administration

of the said decedent's estate ^{with will &} what bond or record & to which
will & bond your orator refers, That the said Henry Harrison
junr hath failed in his life time to pay your orator her aforesaid
legacy with interest thereon or ^{his security} the amount with this Court
for the same nor hath the said administratrix or either of
them paid & discharged the legacy aforesaid or interest - but the
same is now due owing to your orator. And so it is May
it please your ^{best} worship that altho' your orator have
made frequent application for the payment of the aforesaid
legacy of £30 pounds so received in Trust for the benefit
of your orator yet the said Administratrix & the securities
of the said Henry Harrison junr for his due & faithful
discharge of his guardian ^{shd} duties have & still do neglect
to pay & discharge the same. All which is contrary to Justice
& Equity To the end therefore that the said Peggy Harrison
administratrix of the said Henry Harrison junr deced. who hath
since departed with Mills Applewhite who your orator
pray may be made party to this their bill of Complaint &
