Your Complainants respectfully represent and shew unto the Court, and say - That one Richmond J. Pitman, departed this life in the month of December 1852, having first made and executed his Last will and Testament, which was on the 3^d day of January 1853, duly admitted to record in ~~the~~ ^{Isle of Wight} County Court - a copy of which said will is filed herewith as part of this Bill & is marked (A.). That the Testator by his said will appointed Henry N. Womble his Executor, who duly qualified as such Executor on the said 3^d day of January 1853, and took charge of the Testator's Estate - That the Testator died possessed of valuable Lands, slaves and other estate, all of which the said Executor has sold as directed by the said will - That the said Executor has never returned ^{to Court} any account of sale, or any settlement of said Estate & that no Inventory or appraisement thereof has ever been returned to Court - That he has up to this time failed to distribute the said Estate as directed by the said will, notwithstanding the same is ~~not~~ wanted, & is not necessary, to pay debts with, although repeatedly urged to do so.

 Circuit Court of Isle of Wight County, rendered on the
 20th day of October, 1835, in a suit on Chancery depend-
 ing in said court, between Eliza Cross & Thomas H. Scoggin
 administrator of Mallory J. Pitman, decd., Plaintiffs
 & Henry H. Wamble Executor of Richmond J. Pitman
 decd., Defendant, to whom was referred for settlement
 by said decree, the account of the transactions of said Henry
 H. Wamble as executor of Richmond J. Pitman, decd., & the
 account of the amount, due by said Henry H. Wamble as
 executor aforesaid to the several legatees of said testator,
 reports to the court, that on the 13th day of December last
 he issued notices against the several parties aforesaid, requir-
 ing them to attend the settlement of the said accounts
 before him at his said office, on the 23rd of December last
 which were returned to your commissioner duly executed.
 That the said defendant failing to appear on that day
 your commissioner adjourned the taking of said accounts
 to the 6th day of January, when the said parties appeared
 before him, & from the vouchers & papers filed by said
 H. H. Wamble as executor of the said Richmond J. Pitman
 made up the foregoing account of his transactions as ex-
 ecutor aforesaid & of the amounts due from him as such
 executor to the several legatees under the will of said

 interest respectively from the 6th of May 1837. The commissioner
 further reports to the court that on the completion of said ac-
 count he retained the same in his office ten days for the examina-
 tion of the parties; the notices aforesaid & the evidence relating
 thereto are herewith returned.
