be decreed him from his said wife Mary Elizabeth Till-  
son, on the grounds of desertion and abandonment; and  
that your complainant be afforded all such other, fur-  
ther and general relief as the nature of his case  
may require, or to equity shall seem meet.

And your complainant will ever pray, etc.
