- In the Name of God a Men I Thomas Taylor of South-
ampton County being in perfect health Praised be
God do make this my last will and Testament as followeth
- Item I Leave the use of my Plantation Whereon I now Live to my
well beloved wife Katherine Taylor During her natural Life
I Likewise leave the use of my Water Mill and forty nine
acres of Land Joining the mill to my well beloved wife
- Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Hermon Taylor my
Plantation Lying in Northampton County in North
Carolina on the North Side of Meherrin River to him and
his Heirs forever
- Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son James Taylor one hundred
acres of Land Joining to John Edwards Land and Harris
Taylor's and Likewise four Hundred acres of Land Lying
between John Thomas's line and the widow Norfolk to him
and his Heirs forever
- Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son John Taylor one parcel of
Land Joining Arons Branch and Arthur Taylor's line
Excepting fifty acres joining on the branch for Edward
Taylor to him and his heirs forever
- Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Edward Taylor after my
wife's decease my Plantation whereon I now live and fifty
acres of Land over Arons branch and Likewise my mill and
forty nine acres of Land Joining the mill to him and his Heirs forever
- Item I Give and Bequeath to my well beloved wife Katherine Taylor
four Negroes Judy, Patt, Lucy, Frank, to be at her own Disposal
- Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son Harris Taylor one Negro
Called Conney. Item I Give and Bequeath to my Son
Thomas Taylor twenty Shillings
- Item I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Eliza Strickland one
Negro boy Called Jacob
