In the Name of God arrived the twenty fifth day
of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and
sixty Joseph Joyner in the County of South Hampton being
weak of Body but in perfect Sense and Memory that he be
to God do make this my Last Will & Testament in manner
and forme following that is to say first I bequeath my
Soul and Spirit into the Hands of Almighty God my
Heavenly Father by whom of his mere & only Grace I
trust to be saved & received into Eternal Rest through the
Death of my Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ in
whose precious Blood I set the hope of my Salvation
and my Body in hope of a joyful Resurrection I
commit my Body to the Earth to be Buried in a Christian
like manner as my Friends shall think fit & relating
the Distribution of my Worldly Goods I dispose of them
as followeth.

Item I give and bequeath to my Son Joseph Joyner the ^{tion} Parity
whereon I now live also the Land adjoining that I took
up containing one hundred & forty Acres also one Negro
Man named Sam one Bed & furniture which he
hath now in Possession one half of the Cartwheels
and Coopers Tools one still two Guns also one Negro
Woman named Phep to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son John Joyner the Plantation
I bought of Mary Clotter also one Negro Man named
Phil one Bed and furniture which is now call'd his
also twelve pounds twelve Shillings & four pence half
pence current Money one half of the Carpenters ^{& Coopers} Tools
also all the Cattle that is call'd his that are on the
Plantation with mine and of my mark and one
hunting Gun to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Magrat
