In the name of our Lord Jesus Christ I Michael Ellis of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia being of sound mind and memory do make and deliver this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit:
 1st I Give and bequeath to my son James Ellis all my Land and appurtenances to him and his heirs forever
 2nd It is my Will and desire that after my death all my personal estate be sold at public auction or at credit of twelve months taking bonds and approved security by my executor hereafter named
 3rd I Give to my son James Ellis one sixth part of the proceeds of the sale of my personal estate after my just debts is paid to him and his heirs forever
 4th I Give to my Grand Children Brs Hollaway and Corinne Hollaway children of my said daughter Elizabeth Hollaway one sixth part of the proceeds of said sale as above named to be equally divided between the
