

This last will and Testament of Henry Camp did not proceed by the Oath of James J. Darden and Rufus C. Darden, the two Subscribing Witnesses should be ordered to be recorded

Date: 18th October 1877

In the Name of God Amen, I, Robert W. Ferguson of the County of Fentonshampton and State of Virginia, do make and publish this my Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say:

Item 1st. After my Death I wish my Executors to pay my funeral expenses and all of my just debts

Item 2nd. I leave to my wife Sarah C. Ferguson, during her life or widowhood, all of my property of every description as long as she lives a widow, provided she will take and spend all of my young Children until they are twenty five years of age

Item 3rd. After the death of my wife Sarah C. Ferguson I want the value of my property to be equally divided between all of my Children except James and Elizabeth R. Ferguson, wife of Archibald Ferguson, these three Children get nothing and I desire that each one of them shall have Twenty Dollars less than any other child does not stand on account of advances heretofore made to them

Item 4th. Should either of my Children die before they arrive to the age of Twenty One years, then I desire that their portion shall be equally divided between the survivors

Item 5th. And lastly I hereby nominate my son C. Franklin Ferguson Executor of this my last Will and Testament and request the Court not to require Security of him, and to annul all other Wills or Testaments by me heretofore made

At a Court held for the County of Fentonshampton, on the 17th day of May 1877. This last Will and Testament of Robert W. Ferguson did not proceed by the Oath of James J. Darden and Rufus C. Darden, the two Subscribing Witnesses should be ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of C. Franklin Ferguson the Executor thereof named, who made Oath and according to the will and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Five Hundred Dollars, Conditioned as the law directs, (but without Security the will directing that Oath should be required and the Court requiring same) Which bond is ordered to be recorded. Certificate is granted to said C. Franklin Ferguson for Obtaining a probate of the said Will in his favor.
