~~Amos~~ two of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded
 on the motion of the said Ex. who made oath according to law
 certificate is granted him for obtaining patent thereon in due
 form on his giving bond and security. Whereupon the said Reubin
 Boyner with Jeremiah Joyner and Benja. Wilcox his security
 entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of
 three hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs
