Item 6

My will and desire is that all my lands at the cross roads and Taylor old tract be rented out unto my son Robert Nicholson because of age and then to be equally divided between my two sons Robert Nicholson and George C. Nicholson to them and their heirs forever.

Item 7th

At the death or marriage of my wife I give and bequeath to my son Albert Nicholson the plantation otherwise known as the Green and his heirs forever.

Item 8th

My will and desire is that all my lands comprising & including an Ackerly way never be sold by my Executor and equally divided between my daughter Mary Anna Gray John W. Nicholson and Sally C. Nicholson to them and their heirs forever.

Item 9th

My will and desire is that at the death or marriage of my wife all the personal estate bequeathed to her and the increase thereof except negroes be sold and equally divided amongst my children namely Mary Ann Gray Robert Nicholson John W. Nicholson Sally C. Nicholson George C. Nicholson and Albert Nicholson to them & their heirs forever.

And lastly I constitute and appoint Henry Briggs my sole Executor to this my last will and Testament hereby making and making void all other wills by me made. This 25th day of Novr 1821 I signed sealed and delivered in the presence of

At a Court held for the County of Georgetown on the 16th day of December 1821 this will was presented in Court by Henry Briggs the executor therein named proved by the oath of James C. H. Baker John W. Nicholson and James Parham which witnesses were and ordered to be recorded and on the petition of said Court made made oath according to Law certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form on his giving bond and security in the sum of \$1000 together with James Rochelle John H. Hargrave & William Briggs and James Grayant his securities in due form and acted a bond in the penalty of fifty thousand dollars conditioned as the Law directs
