Testament in manner and form following to wit I am fully advised & aware of my present mind & memory  
should be the longest liver that he have my body buried in a decent manner on his plantation Skin Spots and  
bequeath unto his son Benjamin Bradshaw one new feather Bed and furniture to him and  
his heirs forever I am I give and bequeath unto my friend Benjamin Griffin all his remaining part  
of my estate of Every kind whatsoever Consisting of House hold and kitchen furniture 20 of Horses Cattle  
Stock & Hogs all my Crops of every kind together with all my outstanding debts and plantation utensils  
to him and his heirs forever I am I do hereby constitute nominate and appoint my friend Benjamin Griffin  
Executor to this my last will and Testament without all other or former wills by me made in writing  
whenever I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 13<sup>th</sup> day of August 1824
