is mention of 584 acres of excheated land, formerly granted to
Margaret Barrett, dec.

James Barrett had a patent in 1692, but it was deserted
by him and later taken up by William Barrett in 1705, (his son),
(James City Bg, p 658)

Catherine Barrett had a grant of 400 acres in 1714 on
the Chickahominy.

William Barrett listed on Rent Rolls of James City in
1704 for 305 acres.

In 1718 William Barrett was Church Warden of Wilmington
Parish, James City County. (Hening)

From the preceeding data the Barrett pedigree seems to
run as follows:

1. William Barrett - warden of the London Company, 1610.
2. Thomas Barrett in Virginia, 1621, established Barrett's
Ferry. Had at least two sons, William and Francis.
3. William Barrett, Burgess and Councillor, and died
before 1654. Margaret Barrett evidently his widow.
4. James Barrett was married ante 1677 to Mary White,

and still living in 1692, when he patented land.

5. William Barrett takes up land that his father, James, patented in 1692 and deserted in 1705. He may have married Catherine who had a grant of 400 acres on the Chickahominy in 1714. He probably had a brother Charles who married Mary Chiswell. In 1716 Charles Chiswell of Hanover, in behalf of Mary Barrett, offered to undertake the keeping of the college table at the cost of £11 for each scholar per annum. She left two sons, Charles and Robert. Robert qualified as master of the Indian School
